



ENERGY SAVINGS SCHEME

The **Energy Savings Scheme** supports households and businesses across NSW to take action to reduce their energy use and save on their energy bills.

This includes discounts for installing or upgrading to a more energy-efficient appliance or product in your home or business

Installations and Upgrades Covered

For households, this includes upgrading your lights, hot water systems and lights. From 1 November 2024, this extends to installing and operating battery energy storage.

For air-conditioning systems, a discount can be accessed if you choose to install an energy efficient air conditioning system for the first time, or if you replace your old system with a more energy efficient model.

Eligibility

Any household in NSW may be eligible for the scheme. Your ability to access the scheme may depend on whether your location is serviced by an approved supplier and on the potential energy savings of your new appliance or product. For example, if you are replacing an existing air conditioner that is already very efficient, you may not be eligible.



ENERGY SAVING SCHEMES

Getting the Upgrade

- 1 Contact approved suppliers. They will be able to check your eligibility and provide you with a quote. It's a good idea to request quotes from more than one supplier. This way you can ensure you're getting the best deal.

Suppliers work independently and choose which areas they operate in and what products and services they can offer

- 2 Choose the appliance/system that best suits your needs
- 3 Choose an approved supplier before works being. The supplier will provide you with a nomination form. This form must be signed before your installation is complete as you will not be reimbursed for works that are already completed
- 4 Your supplier will send a licensed technician to install your new system/appliance and answer any questions you have around maintenance and use
- 5 The Technician will also dispose of and recycle your old system/appliance, as well as any other equipment that is being replaced
